



Champlain Canalway Trail

A large segment of the Northern Stillwater Trail system to connect to the Saratoga Battlefield.

- This Two mile Trail segment, goes from the North Village Line to the Battlefield on Route 32.
- Project to start this summer

- To be located in the Village of Schuylerville at Fort Hardy Park off US Route 29.
- Construction to begin this year with anticipated opening Spring/Summer of 2017
- Brings tremendous Economic value to Multiple counties and associated municipalities.
