Resolution #16 Authorizing the Highway Superintendent To Purchase Equipment for the Park Areas and Declare the Current Equipment As Surplus and to be Auctioned

WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent has identified a need to purchase two commercial grade riding mowers to maintain all the park and recreation areas;

WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent has identified two commercial grade mowers to purchase and the cost is approximately \$22,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the current units, a John Deere 1445 front mount mower and a John Deere Z960r zero turn mower, are in excess of 8 years old and repairs are becoming expensive and the two mowers should be declared surplus; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with State Law and the Town's Procurement Policy, the surplus town equipment should be sold to the highest bidder at public auction; and

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Highway Superintendent is authorized to purchase the two commercial grade riding mowers at a cost of approximately \$22,000.00.

Resolution #9 Adopting the Town of Stillwater Comprehensive Plan and GEIS Update

WHEREAS the Town Board of the Town of Stillwater identified the need to update the Comprehensive Plan as a result of the Town of Stillwater's growth and change since the adoption of the 2006 Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board formed a Comprehensive Plan Committee on February 16, 2017 and charged it with creating a Comprehensive Plan and GEIS Update; and

WHEREAS, with much public input and with much time and effort, the Comprehensive Plan Committee has recommended to the Town of Stillwater a draft Comprehensive Plan Update to replace the current 2006 Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, said draft Comprehensive Plan Update is available on the Town's website for examination and review by the public; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board, on behalf of the Comprehensive Plan Committee, held a public hearing on the draft Comprehensive Plan and GEIS update on December 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, as per the regulations implementing the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), the adoption or update of a Comprehensive Plan is classified as a Type I Action; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Title 6, Part 617 of the New York Code, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York ("NYCRR"), the Town may waive the requirement for an Environmental Assessment Form ("EAF") if a DGEIS is prepared or submitted under 6 NYCRR 617.6(a)(4); and

WHEREAS, the DGEIS may be treated as an EAF for the purpose of determining significance of the action; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has caused the preparation of the Draft Generic Environmental Impact Statement evaluating the cumulative impacts of growth on the community, is the only involved agency for the purpose of this project, and was declared SEQR Lead Agency for the review of the proposed action on October 15, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the draft Comprehensive Plan Update incorporates a DGEIS, which was submitted to the Town Board on September 17, 2020 and the Town Board has reviewed the same in order to determine the potential for significant adverse environmental impacts and the adequacy of the DGEIS pursuant to SEQR;

WHEREAS, the Town Board previously determined that the Comprehensive Plan Update had the potential for significant adverse impacts and directed that a Positive Declaration be prepared, filed, and published on its behalf, as required in 6 NYCRR Part 617 State Environmental Quality Review; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board previously determined the DGEIS is adequate for public review and directed that a Notice of Completion of the DGEIS be prepared, filed, and published on its behalf, as required in 6 NYCRR Part 617 State Environmental Quality Review; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing to receive public comment on the DGEIS and Comprehensive Plan Update was duly noticed and conducted on January 21, 2021 at 7 PM; and

WHEREAS, the written comment period continued until close of business day on January 31, 2021 or ten (10) days after the close of the public hearing, whichever was later.

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby adopts the Comprehensive Plan and GEIS update posted on the Town Website at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OKE6Bp8gOXY&feature=youtu.be; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is directed to publish a Notice of Adoption of the Comprehensive Plan and GEIS Update in the Town's official newspaper, and be it further

RESOLVED, that Chazen is directed to file the final Comprehensive Plan and GEIS update as required under SEQRA, 6 NYCRR Park 617.
