Deputy Supervisor Vomacka commented on the retirement of the Town Clerk, Sue Cunningham and thanked her for her many years of service to the Town.

Public Hearing—Water District 6 Extension 3

Deputy Supervisor Vomacka called the public hearing to order.

Engineer Lanaro gave a brief summary. The general area of the proposed District is proposed to have water supplied by the Town through an existing system connection to the Saratoga County Water Authority system. Water District 6 extension 3 is proposed to provide water to two subdivision development projects, the Cold Springs Road Mix-Use subdivision and the Forest Ridge Mixed-Use Development.

Public Input: No public input.

With everyone having the opportunity to comment Deputy Supervisor Vomacka closed the public hearing.

Special Presentation Chazen-Labella Business Integration

Engineer Lanaro gave a brief presentation in regard to Chazen Company and service provided to the Town of Stillwater over the last 22 years.

A representative of Labella gave a brief presentation on their firm and how the business integration will bring the same trusted services but with expanded services and resources.

Resolution #96 Establishing Extension 3 to Consolidated Water District 6

Introduced by:	Supervisor	

WHEREAS, a Map Plan and Report, ("MPR") dated November 10, 2021, by the Chazen Companies, a copy of which is attached hereto and has been filed with the Town Clerk's Office for public inspection, providing for a water district extension to be known as the Extension 3 to Consolidated Water District 6 (the "District") as more particularly described in the attached MPR; and

WHEREAS a Public Hearing was held by the Town Board at its regularly scheduled meeting on December 16, 2021, to consider the formation and environmental impact of the Extension 3, Consolidated Water District 6 pursuant to Article 12-A of the NYS Town Law as described in the attached Notice of Hearing, and the public was given an opportunity to comment thereon; and,

WHEREAS, the attached Map, Plan and Report provides a description of the boundaries of Extension 3 to Water District 6, the improvements proposed, the maximum amount to be expended, the proposed method of financing and the environmental significance thereof;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board makes the following findings and conclusions pursuant to Article 12-A of the New York Town Law:

- 1. That the Notice of Public Hearing was published and posted as required by law and is otherwise sufficient;
- 2. That all the property and property owners included within the proposed extended District are benefited thereby;
- 3. That all the property and property owners benefitted are included within the limits of the proposed extended District;
- 4. That the establishment of the extended District is in the public interest;
- 5. That the expenses for the formation of the extended District and the construction of any improvements shall be assessed, levied and collected on a benefit basis from the owners within the extended District;
- 6. That the establishment of the extended District and any construction of water system improvements required for it are hereby approved at a cost to the extended district of \$713 Total Annual Cost per Typical Single Family Home:
- 7. That following review of the Short Environmental Assessment Form and after due deliberations thereon, the Town Board conducted an Uncoordinated Review of the Unlisted Action and issued a Negative Declaration (Determination of Non-Significance) pursuant to the provisions of Article 8 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law (SEQRA); and be it further,

RESOLVED, that Extension 3 to Consolidated Water District 6 be established in the Town, and will include those parcels of property set forth in the map and description annexed to the attached Map, Plan and Report; and it is further;

RESOLVED, that submission of an application for approval to the State Comptroller is not required as the cost to the typical homeowner is estimated at \$713 per year, far below the threshold of \$887 per year requiring Comptroller approval; and be it further,

RESOLVED that this Resolution is subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to Article 7 and §209-e of the New York Town Law and the Town Clerk is directed to post and publish a Notice of Adoption of this Resolution in the Express within 10 days.

Public Input

Dan Coffey (Attorney) representing residents from Secretariat Lane in the Saratoga Glen Development spoke on the proposed amendment changes and the sunset provision within the original PDD. If the owner does not build all lots within five years, the PDD expires and the parcels revert back to the original zoning. He also spoke on the owner having the right to request a two-year extension which was never requested, granted and that also would have expired. Mr. Coffey also read a statement from another resident against the proposed amendment.

Andrew Brick (Attorney) representing TDNI stated that they do not believe the sunset is warranted and the Town should uphold the zoning. If residents are challenging the zoning law it belongs in a court of law and not at a Town Board meeting. He also stated that the owner of PDD has the right to request an extension, with no time line of when the request has to be made, he is formally requesting a two-year extension.

Karen L commented on the Town road signs not being up to state standards and if they plan on correcting this. She also questioned work being done prior to site plan approval, why she has not received a copy of a letter from DEC she requested in regard to Town property on County Rd 76, agenda items and information not being made available online prior to a meeting, FOIL information and why certain records of correspondence are not filed with the Town Clerk for record retention.

Supt Harris stated that the color of road signs was adopted by prior administration and the State standards are being rewritten.

Councilman D'Ambro stated that it is hard to know what is going to be on the agenda since things are removed and added right up until the meeting sometimes.

Discussion was held on the posting of agenda items and when to post.

A discussion was held on the FOIL process and the Town Clerk explained her duties and the appeal process.

Sharon C inquired if they had an update on the water runoff from Revolutionary Heights to Sunrise Lane.

Supt Harris stated that he met with Engineer Lanaro and they did a walk thru.

Engineer Lanaro stated they need to define what approach to take to manage the drainage and stormwater.

Sarah a resident of Saratoga Glen questioned the proposed changes in regard to it being two separate parcels. She stated that it would not amend but expand the proposed changes. She requested that they look at the impact, defend the zoning, and asked if the application was within the boundaries of the PDD.

Attorney Trainor stated that they are looking to expand the boundaries and that it was within the boundaries.

Sara suggested they look at the process and clarify the process at the beginning of the public hearing.
