RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk file a certified copy of Local Law No. 1 of 2022 with the New York Secretary of State within 20 days of its adoption; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall complete, file and maintain in the Office of the Town Clerk the Affidavits of Posting/Publication, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall include the text of the local law within or attached to the minutes of this Town Board meeting per Town Law § 265 (2).

#### 2022 RESOLUTION NO. 17 A Resolution Amending Resolution 5 of 2022 to Limit LaBella Engagement Agreement #11 of 2022 to Woodworth and McCrea Roads in the Revolutionary Heights Subdivision

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS LaBella Associates has presented the Town with 2022 Engagement Agreement #11 which is to authorize professional engineering services related to road and drainage work in the Revolutionary Heights subdivision; and

WHEREAS by Resolution 5 of 2022 adopted on January 20, 2022, the Town Board authorized the Supervisor to sign LaBella Engagement Agreement #11 regarding services for at least three roads in the Revolutionary Heights Subdivision; and

WHEREAS subsequent to January 20<sup>th</sup>, a meeting was held with the developer, resulting in the narrowing of the scope of professional services needed.

### 2022 RESOLUTION NO. 19 A Resolution Declaring Highway Equipment Surplus and Authorize the Highway Superintendent to Conduct an Auction for Surplus Equipment

WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent has declared that the following equipment, a LANDA portable pressure washer, has no further useful life to the Town Highway Department and therefore declares it to be "surplus" to the Town: and

WHEREAS, in accordance with State Law and the Town's Procurement Policy, the surplus town equipment should be sold to the highest bidder at public auction.

RESOLVED, that the LANDA portable pressure washer is hereby declared surplus and the Highway Superintendent is authorized to conduct an auction for the sale of the surplus equipment to the highest bidder.

#### 2022 RESOLUTION NO. 20 A Resolution Regarding A Contract For the Expenditures of Highway Monies

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 284 of the New York State Highway Law, the Town Board is required to have a written agreement with the Highway Superintendent for the expenditure of budgetary funds related to the repair and improvement of all roadways, sluices, culverts and bridges having a span of less than 5 feet and boardwalks and renewals thereof; and,

WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent has proposed the attached Agreement for the Town Board's consideration; and

WHEREAS, pending approval of said agreement, the Highway Superintendent has and will submit proposed expenditures on vouchers for Town Board approval prior to the expenditure being made except in cases of actual emergencies.

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby approves the attached 2022 written agreement with the Highway Superintendent pursuant to Section 284 of the New York State Highway Law for the expenditure of budgetary funds related to the repair and improvement of all roadways, sluices, culverts and bridges having a span of less than 5 feet and boardwalks and renewals thereof; and be it further

RESOLVED, that each of the Town Board Members are to sign the Section 284 Agreement indicating the Board's support of its terms.
