2022 RESOLUTION NO. 74

BOND RESOLUTION DATED AUGUST 18, 2022

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN OF STILLWATER, SARATOGA COUNTY, NEW YORK IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$4,500,000 PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW TO FINANCE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITY AND DELEGATING THE POWER TO ISSUE BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE SALE OF SUCH BONDS TO THE TOWN SUPERVISOR.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Stillwater, Saratoga County, New York (the "Town") (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all of the members of the Board) as follows:

SECTION 1. The specific purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") to be financed pursuant to this resolution is the construction of a 13,010 square-foot public safety facility on County Route 76 to house the Town's police department, emergency medical services and court offices. The estimated maximum cost of said purpose is \$4,500,000.

SECTION 2. The Town Board plans to finance the total cost of said purpose by the issuance of serial bonds of the Town in an amount not to exceed \$4,500,000, hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the Local Finance Law.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in subdivision 11(b) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is twenty-five (25) years.

SECTION 4. It is hereby determined that the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will be in excess of five (5) years.

SECTION 5. Current funds are not required to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution or any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds.

SECTION 6. The proceeds of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the specific purpose set forth herein. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations.

SECTION 7. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of the Town a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 8. Subject to the terms and contents of this resolution and the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 21.00, 30.00, 50.00 and 56.00 to 63.00, inclusive, of said Law, the power to authorize bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and the renewals of said notes, and the power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said serial bonds and said bond anticipation notes (including, without limitation, dates, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, consolidation with other issues, manner of execution and redemption rights), and the power to determine to issue said bonds providing for substantially level or declining debt service, and the power to sell (including, without limitation, receipt of bids submitted in an electronic format) and deliver said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the Town. The Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign any serial bonds issued pursuant to this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said serial bonds, and the Town Clerk is hereby authorized to affix the corporate seal of the Town to any of said serial bonds or any bond anticipation notes and to attest such seal.

SECTION 9. The Town Supervisor is hereby further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross

income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" in accordance with Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

SECTION 10. The validity of said serial bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said serial bonds may be contested only if:

(1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or

(2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or

(3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

SECTION 11. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish this resolution, or a summary thereof, together with a notice in substantially the form provided by Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law, in <u>The Express Newspaper</u> and <u>The Daily Gazette</u>, two newspapers having a general circulation in the Town and hereby designated as the official newspapers of the Town for such publication, after the period of time shall have elapsed for the submission and filing of a petition for a permissive referendum and a valid petition shall not have been submitted and filed.

SECTION 12. This resolution is adopted subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to Section 35.00 of the Local Finance Law.

5.) Public Input-

Resident Thumen stated the water supply in Glen Hollow is inconsistent billing, uses estimated business figures, not receiving 1st quarter billing but received 2nd and 3rd. and bills were over \$1000.00 the website is and has been under construction, the meters are not being read, phone calls are not returned. And the water quality is very poor. He questioned if the Town can get them out of this privately-owned water company.

Resident Fiacco state the water is staining everything, Oder is bad and a black sediment is visible.

Resident Fiacco stated the water issue has been going on for some time now and they have videos of water appearances. It is well water but is should be serviceable.

Resident Tate stated a common occurring threat is ruining appliances and the company gives excuses. When a hydrant flushing occurs, the sinks and toilets are getting damaged. The company is blaming the homeowners. Asking town if there is any recourse.

Ed Kinowski stated there were new meters for all and suggested writing a letter, get more people involved and start a petition.

6.) Other Business

Supervisor Ed Kinowski discussed upcoming grants use and bond that is in progress. The bond is for the public safety building that will secure the ambulance, police and court system on near the corner of 75 & 76. The old building on Hudson Avenue was built in the 1800's and needed to be replaced. The land on 75 & 76 that was purchased for the new Public Safety Building is now out for bid until August 31, 2022 and will not exceed 4.5 million dollars and hopefully will not increase taxes.

Supervisor Ed Kinowski thanked the following town employees for coordinating the installation of a new playground installation at the Riverside Park: Artie, Clayton Ellen and Sue. Supervisor Kinowski spoke about the Champlain Canal Regional Gateway Visitor Center. This is a collaborative effort of non-profit and federal, state and local governments to introduce locals and travelers about Champlain Canal Region of Lakes to Locks Passage. The center is located along the 60-mile path of the Champlain Canal on Route 29/Ferry street in Schuylerville. The opening will be in October.

Supervisor Kinowski distributed a notice to area residents on Frog Island other wise known as Riverside. The water tank on West St is scheduled to be raised in the next few weeks. It is currently not in use. And will be no disruption in water. The Town has a lease with Verizon to use the tank as a cell service communication tower. Once the tank is removed a monopole will be erected to provide continued and improved cell service. Also, another water line is expected on East St.

Councilwoman Vomacka announced Family Day 2022

Events that will be happening are: food and craft vendors, free carnival rides, live bands, corn hole tournament, chicken BBQ, free crafts for kids, Karaoke contest, Photo contest, selfie station and a lot more.
