Public hearing- Bocrest Fields PDD Amendment continued from September 2021

Presentation by Frank Palumbo,

Mr. Palumbo stated some Factors:

- There will be stop signs throughout development.
- Two traffic studies thus far where numbers were consistent
- Went from a long rectangle to more compact shape, which gives more space, another 85 ft from road to give more opportunity for trees and landscape will be provided and allows us to move buildings farther away from neighbors.
- Accomplished designing a driveway from not directing lights right on houses. Now there is no traffic directly facing the houses.
- 13 buildings- 24 units, 312 apartments.
- Modifications were made with assessments.

- PDD language has made modifications and will need to reviewed by TB.
- o 2027 design year- projected time frame
- Traffic analysis is an educated guess. Counting is done on specific days and times.

Joe Lanaro from LaBella presented the traffic study conducted by independent company Creighton-Manning Stats: US RTE 4 and brickyard rd. 40 MPH Halfway house 30 MPH. Data collected using unmetered traffic devices- 7am- 9am and 4-6 pm peak hours were 730-830 and 430-530 rte 4 7,915 vehicles a day.

120 new vehicles in AM and 150 in the PM peak hours.
