Presentation on Proposed Transfer of Development Rights Law Matt Rogers of La Bella Associates

The Town of Stillwater Comprehensive Plan/GEIS recommends the Town adopt a Transfer of Development Rights (TDR) law to encourage development in appropriate locations, while reducing sprawl and the loss of farmland and key open space areas. The TDR law is intended to allow for unused development rights within existing and future T2 Zoning Districts to be

transferred to areas where higher density development is being encouraged. The proposed local law provides a means for direct transfer between land owners and developers when combined with a site plan or subdivision review process.

A Public Hearing will be announced soon and the public will have input at that time.

WHEREAS, the Town Building, Planning and Development Department has submitted a proposed Transfer of Development Rights ("TDR") local law for the Town Board's consideration; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board feels it is appropriate to conduct a coordinated review of the proposed legislation pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to have notices sent to potential involved or interested agencies of the Board's intent to serve as Lead Agency for the SEQRA review.

WHEREAS, the attached draft of the TDR Local Law has been created through the involvement of many interested people in town and is now ready for public review.

Resolution No. 26 A Resolution Authorizing the Supervisor to Sign Two Agreements Regarding the Transfer of the Luther Forest Technology Campus from LFTCEDC to GF Innovation LLC

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS, in 2008 the Town of Stillwater adopted the Luther Forest Technology Campus Planned Development District ("PDD") which, among other things, required certain responsibilities and obligations from the landowners within the PDD area; and

WHEREAS, in 2009 the Luther Forest Technology Campus Economic Development Corporation ("LFTCEDC") signed a Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions ("Declaration") whereby it undertook certain responsibilities and obligations to maintain the property it owned on the Luther Forest Technology Campus ("LFTC" or "Campus"); and

WHEREAS, the Declaration requires LFTCEDC to notify and obtain the consent of the Town of Stillwater to a proposed transfer of land on the Campus and to ensure that the property transferee undertakes LFTCEDC's obligations under the Declaration and PDD; and

WHEREAS, one of the obligations to be undertaken by the property transferee is to undertake to maintain the Non-Standard Features within the rights-of-way of the sections of Luther Forest Boulevard and Luther Forest Boulevard Extension located within the Town of Stillwater.

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes the Supervisor to sign an Agreement with Saratoga County and GlobalFoundries Innovation LLC whereby the ownership of the portions of Luther Forest Boulevard and Luther Forest Boulevard Extension located in the Town of Stillwater will be transferred to the County and the maintenance of the Non-Standard Features within the road rights-of-way will be undertaken by either GlobalFoundries Innovation LLC or the County of Saratoga; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board also hereby authorizes the Supervisor to sign an Assignment and Assumption Agreement transferring LFTCEDC's obligations under the Declaration to GlobalFoundries Innovation LLC, the proposed property transferee; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution authorizing the conveyance of Town real property is subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to NYS Town Law §§64 and 220; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is hereby requested to publish a Notice of the Adoption of this Resolution to enter into a conveyance Agreement with Saratoga County in both the Mechanicville Express and the Schenectady Gazette as required by law.

Resolution No. 27 A Resolution Authorizing One-Day Marriage Officiant Licenses

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS, the NYS Domestic Relations Law, Chapter 14, Article 3 has been amended for Town/City Clerks to provide for designation of a one-day marriage officiant license, which became effective March 28, 2023, and

WHEREAS, the authority is limited to applicants who want to marry a couple to whom the Town Clerk issued a marriage license and limited to the specific couple identified in the application and for that specific ceremony; and

WHEREAS, the NYS legislation clearly states the information to be included in the application for a one-day officiant license and its requirements, and entitles the Town Clerk to collect a twenty-five-dollar fee for the service to be retained by the Town.

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is authorized to accept applications for and issue One-Day Marriage Officiant Licenses upon ensuring that all NYS requirements are met and may collect a twenty-five-dollar fee to be retained by the Town.

Resolution No. 28 A Resolution Allowing an Alternate Water Connection for the Hudson Heights Apartment Complex

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS, the Turning Point PDD legislation contained in the Town Code currently requires that the developer establish a secondary water connection through the Hudson Heights Apartment complex to the public water main on Brickyard Road; and

WHEREAS, the developer has requested via the attached letter, and the Town's Highway Superintendent recommends, that the secondary water connection requirement be waived to allow just the primary connection to a private water line located at the end of Artillery Approach; and

WHEREAS, Section 144 of the Turning Point PDD legislation provides that the Town Board may, upon the request of the owners of the site, modify any of the provisions of the PDD local law upon such terms as the Town Board determines to be reasonable.

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that pursuant to the authority contained in Section 144 of the PDD legislation, the Town Board hereby waives the current PDD requirement for the developer to establish a secondary water connection to the public water main at Brickyard Road and instead utilize a private water line as the primary water source connection for the Hudson Heights Apartment complex, conditional upon the private water line being designed and constructed to Town of Stillwater Consolidated Water District standards.

Resolution No. 29 A Resolution Authorizing Change Order No. 1for the East Street Neighborhood Watermain Replacement Project

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS, Kubricky Construction has submitted Change Order No. 1 to the East Street Watermain Replacement Project for total of \$110,000.00 to cover its overtime charges in dealing with unexpected conditions on the project; and

WHEREAS, LaBella Associates has also incurred additional contract administration expenses to oversee Kubricky's overtime work by an additional \$52,000.00.

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes the Supervisor to sign Change Order No. 1 to the East Street Neighborhood Watermain Replacement Project to pay the Kubricky Company the additional amount of \$110,000.00; and

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby approves an additional payment to LaBella Associates in the amount of \$52,000.00 for additional contract administration expenses.

Topics for discussion

Supervisor Kinowski

Stated there is a contract change with Global Foundries LFTEC. See Resolution No. 26 applied above.

Budget monies- Marriage officiant fees will go into the general fund account.

Joe Lanaro- La Bella Engineers

Construction contract change order- East St. has started with Tom Kubricky and they encountered unforeseen structures. A lot of items need to be repaired which resulted in more

work and labor hours, Increase in contract by \$110,000.00. This will need to take place at this or the next board meeting.

The contractor will need this to be executed as the first payment needs to include this work. This is a 10% change from original which includes a 10% contingency. Currently at 2 weeks into a 4-month process. This is the worst section of the town.

Any forthcoming changes need to be approved by the Town Board.

Supervisor Kinowski explained process of resolutions and the public input process at meetings.

Storm water management will be available on website and at town hall, first week of May.

Public Input

Don, resident of 1512 Route 4, questioned why do we have a TDR program, what makes it Ok? Supervisor Kinowski recommended they attend the public hearing on May 18th.

Supervisor Kinowski spoke of enforcement in town codes. A lot of complaints with residents riding ATV, etc. fast and loud up and down neighborhood roads. Putting livestock on properties where they are not allowed. Residents are starting to look at greens and animals on their properties. He added, we will start to address. Police commissioner and Chief of police will look into codes.

Josh, resident from Soshine Farm Rd., asked about minutes and when they are posted. It was explained that meeting minutes are drafted and approved by next board meeting then posted on website.

Other Business

Councilperson Masterson

Stated she and Danielle Cowin, Town Clerk, met with E Waste company regarding the possibility of having an electronics day or days in our town and will send Matt the materials. Further discussion to be determined.

Town wide cleanup day is May 6th. Village garage sales same weekend along with a car show at the school.

Supervisor Kinowski

The framing is up on the public safety building and moving along.

A flag of the Town of Stillwater was created by a student named – Tim Van Vraken years ago and was excepted by the Town Board.

Councilperson Vomacka

Working with town historian on a historical trail starting at the Blockhouse and ending at the National Cemetery for the 250th Saratoga County Bicentennial Celebration.

Boy Scouts will start painting the interior of the blockhouse for their community service.
