Resolution No. 52

A Resolution Adopting Local Law 4 of 2023, a Local Law Amending Section 176-23 of the Town Code Regarding Sidewalks

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS, a linkage study was conducted to help determine the best locations and policies for the construction and maintenance of sidewalks, multi-use pathways and trails within the Town; and

WHEREAS, it shall be the policy of this Town Board that, effective upon the adoption of this resolution, new applications for land development in the Town of Stillwater shall not be required to adhere to the sidewalk construction and maintenance requirements contained in Chapter 176, Article VI of the Subdivision Design Standards in the Stillwater Town Code, Section 176-23 Pedestrian ways, B, (1), and B (2). In lieu of the installation of sidewalks on local streets, developers shall be required to pay a fee equal to the cost of the installation of such sidewalks to be used by the Town for implementation of recommendations made as a result of the linkage study; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on August 17, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. at Town Hall, 881 Hudson Avenue, Stillwater, New York, to receive comments from the public regarding the proposed Amendment to Section 176.23 of the Town Code regarding sidewalks; and

Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the time period for receiving public comments and submissions is now closed; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby adopts Local Law 4 of 2023, a local law amending Section 176.23 of the Town Code regarding sidewalks;

and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall immediately post and publish notice of the adoption of this Resolution in the Express or Gazette with a descriptive summary or extract of the Local Law within 5 days pursuant to Article 16 of the Town's Zoning Code and obtain Affidavits of Publication therefore; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk file a certified copy of Local Law No. 4 of 2023 with the New York Secretary of State within 20 days of its adoption and shall file a copy of the local law with the County Planning Agency and the Town Planning Board; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall complete, file and maintain in the Office of the Town Clerk the Affidavits of Posting/Publication, and maintain a separate file for zoning changes, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall include the text of the local law within or attached to the minutes of this Town Board meeting per Town Law §265(2).

Asked Councilperson Masterson to check on the size of the box truck that would come and collect the recycled electronics.

Stated the Town is looking for ways to inhibit the growth of blue algae on Browns Beach. The beach will close on Sunday September 3, 2023.

Outlined some the projects which have been built as the town was able to build up its fund balance to afford the projects. Some of them are the new Public Safety Building, the Tower on West Street and water lines on East Street.

Reported the National Park owns half the road and town owns other half of Lohnes Road. The national park service has a higher estimate than the towns engineer, LaBella. Details of the final cost will have to be worked out, which combined with the estimated \$1 million cost+ will mean the road will be closed for the remainder of this year.

LOCAL LAW FILING

TOWN OF STILLWATER LOCAL LAW NO. 4 OF 2023

- Purpose: The purpose of this Local Law is to amend Town Code Chapter 176, § 176-23
 "Pedestrianways"
- 2. The amendments are indicated below in <u>underlined</u> text.

§176-23

- A. Sidewalks on collector roads. All streets designated as collector roads shall have, at a minimum, a five-foot wide sidewalk on both sides of the street. All such sidewalks shall be so placed that there will be a distance of three feet between the sidewalk and the street paving and a distance of four feet between the inner edge of the sidewalk and the right-of-way line. Planting of street trees will be permitted in the space between the sidewalk and the right-of-way line.
- B. Sidewalks on local streets. All local streets shall be provided with a sidewalk on one or both sides of the street, at the discretion of the planning board. Such sidewalks shall be located as follows:
 - 1. When a sidewalk is to be provided along only one side of a local street, the street paving shall be offset from the right-of-way center line by eight feet. The sidewalk shall be five feet in width and so placed that there will be a distance of three feet between the sidewalk and the street paving. Planting of street trees will be permitted in the space between the sidewalk and the right-of-way line only.
 - 2. When sidewalks are to be constructed along both sides of a local street, the street paving shall be centered within the right-of-way. Each sidewalk shall be five feet in width and so placed that there will be a distance of three feet between the sidewalk and the street paving. Planting of street trees will be permitted in the space between the sidewalk and the right-of-way line only.
- C. Community Benefit in Lieu of Installation. The Planning Board will have the option to, at its discretion, accept a monetary community benefit in lieu of requiring the installation of sidewalks as outlined in B (1) and B (2) of this Section. Funds collected can be used to help fund a town-wide pathway linkage study in the future or for placement of pedestrian ways in areas already designated by the Town as in need. This monetary contribution must be in an amount of no less than the amount it would cost the Town to install the sidewalks at the project location in order to meet current code specifications based on prevailing wages and other municipal requirements.
